- After completion of the theory examination, answer scripts are assessed by following the prescribed rules of the University.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- There is a Ramanlal P. Soni Research Centre in the College for the last 7 years this centre motivate and encourages the students for research works. The research committee comprises of the Principal and faculty members of the college.
- The Institution motivates teachers to take up both Major and Minor Research Projects
- Encourages teachers to improve their API scores through participation in various conferences, workshops, seminars and also through publishing articles, books and research findings
- Plans to publish a research journal with ISSN number.
- Supports teachers to avail study leaves as permissible under the UGC.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

**LIBRARY** : The College library has a collection of around 50,000 (Fifty thousand) copies of text and reference books covering a wide range of subjects. Besides useful journals, magazines and newspapers are subscribed regularly. Efforts are in progress to modernize our library. This would helps the students to cope up with the present situation. In the Reading Room, attached to the library, reference books, journals, magazines and newspapers can be consulted. Every student will be issued two library cards against which he/she can borrow books, one against each card. Departments and provided with two extra library cards.

**ICT:** The requirements for virtual classrooms are often used for teaching and learning purpose. A 24 hour power back up is available for the entire College. Internet access is available for the benefit of the students, teachers and staff of the College.
