





- Number of students in a batch for practical examination shall not be more than 15 under normal circumstances.
- Students are required to keep a record of practical work in journal form, duly signed by the teacher-incharge on all exercises and certified by Head of the Department and Principal of the college.
- Candidates who have not completed their journal work shall not be allowed to appear in the practical examination.
- Separate passing in practical examination is necessary. Students have to obtain minimum of 15 out of 40
 marks of practical examination and 10 out of 30 marks related theory examination.
