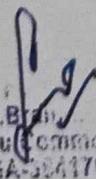

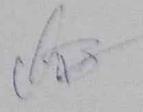

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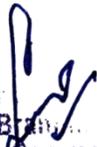

**Shri S.K.Shah and Shri Krishna O.M.Arts College Modasa** was established in 1960, affiliated to HNGU Patan. The college offers BA (Honours) courses in English, Gujarati, Hindi, Psychology, and Economics. The college offers four courses Sanskrit, English, Gujarati, and Hindi in PG.
